Safeguarding : The school's staff has a legal duty of care that requires them to share with Devon's Multi Agency Safeguarding Hub, any information regarding the safety and wellbeing of any pupils in the school. The Governing Body and the Headteacher have a similar duty of care for the safety of school staff. As such, it is likely that the record made of an individual's violent, aggressive or defamatory behaviour shown towards school staff, including comment on social networking sites, will be passed on to any future school of college. This is the agreed policy for the protection and wellbeing of all those who work in the schools and college which make up the Tiverton Co-operative Learning Partnership.

- ✓ Ensure that my/our child is dressed according to the school code of dress as outlined in the Parent Handbook, and is properly equipped for all lessons
