Big Battery Hunt - We are taking part in a national campaign to help recycle more batteries. The Year 6 children have started collecting batteries and have managed to collect nearly 1000 batteries so far. We now have large recycling containers in school which we can get collected free of charge by a local recycling company. If you have any used batteries, then please send them in to Year 6 and we can add them to our growing collection. There is a chance for us to win different prizes for the school, including iPads and energizer bunnies, if we can collect and recycle lots of batteries before Easter.

Coming Soon Maths Monkey - To help promote the children's love of maths, we are going to send home Maths Monkeys to some of the children in Reception and Year 2. The idea is to help your child learn some real life maths. You might take him shopping where he could help add prices up or find the correct coins to pay with. You might take him on a trip and teach him about the bus timetable, or just let him help plan what television you will watch using the TV schedule. He could help you remember what time to go to bed. You could also let him help you cook and weigh ingredients or adjust the size of recipes. We will be sending him home with a book

which you could use to record his maths adventure in. You don't have to go anywhere special or different, it just has to involve some maths. The Year 6 children will be organising and running this project and will select the first lucky families after half term. If a Maths Monkey does come home with your child, then please look after him and let him help you and your child enjoy a maths adventure together.
