Road safety- We have invested in some yellow signs which are placed on the double yellow lines outside school to discourage parents from parking there. This is to ensure the safety of our pupils and all members of the school community. We placed the 6 yellow signs on the road on Tuesday morning, however there were only 5 left at the end of the day. We look forward to the safe return of our missing sign.

PANTS rule- During the year we regularly revisit the NSPCC PANTS rules as part of our PSHE teaching. During these discussions we will aim to teach our pupils the following important safety skills without giving explicit information or telling scary stories. We will be teaching our pupils how to stay safe by learning the PANTS rules, which the NSPCC have developed.

PANTS stands for:

- Privates are private.
- Always remember your body belongs to you.
- No means no.
- Talk about secrets that upset you.
- Speak up, someone can help.

The lessons will introduce a range of ideas, all delivered in a way that's fully age-appropriate, empowering pupils without using any frightening words.

These include:

- good and bad touching
- your child's right to say no to things that make them feel upset or uncomfortable.
- naming parts of the body
- who your child can turn to if they ever feel upset or worried.
