Absence reporting email

A request around fidget, sensory and/or transitional toys.

We are very aware of the recent craze around Poppets and fidget toys and have noticed a significant increase in the number of children are bringing these toys into school from home.

We are currently still following government guidance regarding Covid-19 and our risk assessment identifies minimising objects going to and from home and school.

In some cases, objects have been agreed by the SEND Team or class teacher as it has been deemed that a child may benefit from this. In this instance, we ask that the object (or up to a max of 3 objects) stays in school and the child is encouraged to keep it/them in their tray or bag until it is required. The object is used only in agreement with the class teacher. If these objects are found to be causing additional disruption to a child rather than helping them to regulate or improve attention/focus, the class teacher may ask them to put them away.

For those children where specific items have been agreed this can continue. However, we ask that parents do not send their child in to school with any objects without prior discussion and agreement with the class teacher or a member of the SEND Team.

Outstanding debts

As you are aware schools across the country have very tight budgets and we are no exception. We have to think very carefully about what we spend our budget on and we conscious of every penny. We currently have over £300 owed to school in unpaid school lunch money. As you can appreciate this has a significant impact on our budget. Our school meals are provided by the external company Devon Norse. We have to pay them for every meal that is ordered. Therefore we have to pay for those meals which haven't been paid for by you from our budget until your debts are paid. This means we have less money to spend on teaching and learning and essential resources for the children.

Chasing unpaid debts takes time and ultimately money again from our very tight budget.

Please can we ask that all meals are paid for either in advance or on the day so that you don't incur debts. If you have unpaid debts please pay them immediately. The larger the debt, the harder it becomes to pay it off.

Thanking you in advance for your support with this ongoing issue.
