**On Thursday, 20<sup>th</sup> January 2022**

Is your child in Reception, Years 1 and 2 or entitled to free school meals in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6? If so, please can you help by ensuring that your child has a school dinner on Thursday, 20<sup>th</sup> January 2022.

This is the day when the School Census is taken and if all of our children have the meals they are entitled to, the school will be given the money required to offer free school meals to all Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 pupils and those pupils entitled to free school meals in Key Stage 2. If children do not take up their provision on Thursday, 20<sup>th</sup> January, but have meals throughout the rest of the year, the cost has to come from the school's general budget which means there is less money to spend on teaching and learning. You will be aware from the media of increasing financial pressures on schools and at Heathcoat Primary School we would like to spend all of our money on the children's education.

If you feel that you can help us in achieving this and your child is in Reception, Years 1 and 2 or entitled to free school meals in Years 3-6 please encourage them to take up their school meal this Thursday and help us to help your children.

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## Hannah Gleeson – Safeguarding & Early Help Officer



My role as Safeguarding & Early Help Officer is to provide support to families and school staff with any safeguarding concerns and lead in Early Help.

I provide specific support to Miss Higginson Designated Safeguarding Lead, and work closely with professional agencies including Social Workers, Police, Youth Intervention Team and health professionals to ensure families and children are supported and kept safe. I also represent the school by attending multiagency meetings.

As lead in Early Help R4C, I provide intensive work with individual pupils and their family to identify barriers and access support services and interventions. Early Help brings together support around the family from a range of services and teams who will work together with the whole family to help improve the situation for everyone. I am a point of contact for families who would like to talk about any concerns or barriers they may have, and provide advice and guidance in accessing support services. I provide support for families by signposting and/or delivering parent support programmes and work closely with our teaching staff and SEN Team to effectively engage pupils and their families with support for low attendance, school refusal, bereavement, antisocial behaviour, wellbeing/mental health and barriers learning.

I have a really varied role and can support families from Leading in TAF (Team Around the Family) meetings, supporting in applications to services, acting as an advocate to just being an understanding ear when you need one. I aim to support families by accessing the right avenues of support through referrals and enabling you to positively access and engage in the support you may need for yourselves and you family.

As a school we access many services such as CHAT, Balloons, Young Carers, local Parent Progression Team and Family Intervention Teams.

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### Positive cases & self isolation

As you are aware we have had positive cases amongst staff and children across the school. We have seen fewer children test positive over the weekend than last weekend. The majority of children who tested positive had a headache or felt slightly unwell, therefore it is important that you don't send your child to school if they are feeling unwell.

The rules around self-isolation change today and you can start testing on day 5. The day that you had the initial positive result is day 0 and then you need to complete 5 full days before testing on a LFT. If you have a negative result on day 5 and 6 you can then stop self-isolating after the 2 negative LFT.

Staffing across some year groups remains difficult due to staff absence and the high demand for supply teachers. We are working hard to keep the school open for all year groups.
