Packed lunches

We have noticed that some children are having a really well-balanced packed lunch box with wraps, fresh fruit and vegetables. Thank you and well done!

However, there are still quite a considerable number of children who have a lot of processed foods in their lunchbox e.g. a dairylea dunker is fine if it is the only processed item in the lunchbox, but that alongside a packet of crisps and a sausage roll means that your child is potentially eating more than their daily salt allowance in one meal.

Having a mini roll, a cake slice plus a packet of mini cookies will most certainly take them over their daily sugar allowance. This also can mean that children feel a sugar rush which then means they feel more tired in the afternoon. This can impact on their learning. Please only include one sweet item - and consider whether this is daily or just once/twice per week.

Please note that chocolate bars should not be included in your child's lunchbox. We are also a nut-free school, so please do not send in any nutella products or chocolate spread.

Ukraine appeal



A huge thank you to everyone who came wearing blue and yellow on Friday and made a donation to support those affected by the conflict in Ukraine. We raised a massive £511.50, which is being donated to the Rotary Club of Tiverton who are supporting the humanitarian crisis in Ukraine. This is an example of how the money you donated will be used:

- **£10** could provide essential hygiene supplies for one person for one month
- **£20** could provide emergency food for one person for one month
- **£50** could provide blankets for 4 families to keep them warm
- **£80** could provide essential hygiene supplies for 8 people for one month
- **£100** could provide emergency food to a family of 5 for one month
- **£300** could provide blankets for 24 families to keep them warm
