#### Day of strike action 1<sup>st</sup> February

You will have received a letter on Friday explaining the partial opening on Wednesday.

Having completed a risk assessment and based on health and safety grounds, **the following classes will be open on** Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> February:

#### FSDB, FSA, 2SP, 4P and 6SC.

Unfortunately, there will not be sufficient staffing for all children to attend school and so **the following classes will be closed:** 

#### FSGH, 1B, 1D, 2CP, 3E, 3K, 4C, 5K, 5F, 6S

The children of critical workers and those children who are vulnerable have been informed if they have a place at school. If your child does have a place at school under these criteria they will be taught in the following spaces:

KS1 (years 1 and 2) will be taught in the blue hall and KS2 (years 3 - 6) will be taught in the year 5 classrooms. They need to go straight to these spaces on arriving at school and this is where you will collect them from. At the end of the day.

Breakfast club and after school is still available for those children who are in school and needs to be booked in the normal way.

Please note that Government guidance Handling Strike Action In Schools, January 2023 states: "if a school has to restrict attendance by telling some pupils not to attend school on a strike day, the Y code should be used for pupils who are told not to attend. **Pupils who are required to attend should be marked in the normal way**. If a pupil is required to attend school on a strike day but does not, then they must be recorded as absent. The Y code does not count towards the pupil or school's absence record."


