In the last week of the term, we were delighted to welcome back ex-pupil, Millie Gubby, who is starring in the musical Aspects of Love (with Michael Ball) in London's West End. Millie came in to inspire our current pupils to Never Give Up and to Aim High (2 of our TRAIN values). The children learnt that Millie (who is now 17 years old) has been dancing and performing since she was 2/3 years old at Willow Tree Dance and Theatre Company, and that she practises for up to 12 hours a week on top of her school work. Millie shared that she has been to lots of auditions and been told 'no' on countless occasions, but that she keeps trying and being resilient. She has performed in festivals where she has won gold medals, and came 2nd in the 'All England' competition for her Song and Dance performance. As well as answering questions about the show, Millie sang 'Colours of the Wind' from Pocahontas. 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Become a packed lunch pro!

As we return to school, and finances can be tight, it can be tricky to come up with packed lunch ideas that are healthy, cheap and interesting.

<u>Bagels, bread, wraps</u>: If you buy a loaf of bread, some wraps or bagels and don't want to use the whole packet, you can freeze a few items in freezer bags. (Make sure that squeeze the air out of the freezer bag before freezing). This is great for saving on waste.

<u>Making sandwiches</u> Use mature cheddar and cut it using a potato peeler (or grate it) to make it go further. The stronger taste means you can use a little less cheese but still get the flavour.

<u>Pasta salad</u> – cook your pasta and mix it with a sauce. Try adding some cooked mixed vegetables. You can make a big batch and then put it in containers to use for several people, or make several lunches over 2 or 3 days.

<u>Fruit and veg</u>- bananas, apples, carrots and cucumber last all week in the fridge and don't go soggy in lunchboxes.

<u>Hummus or dips</u> -if you buy a bigger pot of dip or hummus, you can decant it into smaller pots and have dips each day. This is cheaper than buying the small pots.

<u>Homemade</u> flapjacks and cakes are cheaper to make than they are to buy -and you know what ingredients are going into them.

Please remember that we have children in school with nut allergies. Please do <u>not</u> use NUTELLA or allow children to bring in HAZELNUT spread/crepes.









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Golden tickets and Top Table

In order to encourage super lunchtime behaviour, we have an INDOOR and OUTDOOR behaviour target for each half term.

Currently the indoor target is to use indoor voices and finish food in our mouths before we speak to our friends.

The outdoor target is respect- we will play kindly (no rough play).

When the mealtime assistants (MTAs) see children who are making the effort towards these targets, they will give them a 'Golden Ticket'. The child post this into a little box in their classroom and each week a golden ticket is picked from the box. That child gets to sit (with a chosen friend) on the 'Top Table' on Friday lunchtimes.

Top Table is a special table at the front of the dinner hall with a tablecloth and flowers. A member of staff joins the children for lunch and each child gets served their lunch to the table by an MTA rather than having to queue.

The children who achieve top table are mentioned in the newsletter each week.
