Dear all at Heathcoat Primary School,

I am writing to thank you for the very kind donation of food you have recently made to CHAT. We have been reviewing figures recently for our annual report and are shocked by the increases we are seeing across all services, but specifically the foodbank. There has been a 143% increase on foodbank usage last year and a 53% increase in overall services.

We couldn't match this need without the support of the local community and are incredibly grateful to have been thought of.

The coming months, we feel are going to be tricky ones, but we are glad to be here for the Mid Devon community as a hub for housing, debt and food support and advice.







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
