Administration of medicine


Just a reminder that only prescribed medication can be administered to pupils at school. Medication should be handed in at the school office by a parent/carer.



An easy way for you to help our school budget via your child's school dinner!

Is your child in Reception, Years 1 and 2 or entitled to free school meals in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6? If so, please can you help by ordering your child a school dinner on Thursday 5th October 2023.

Why?

This is the day of the School Census.

If ALL of our children have the meals that they are entitled to, the school will be given the money required to offer free school meals to all Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 pupils as well as those pupils entitled to free school meals in Key Stage 2.

If children do not take up their provision on Thursday 5th October, but have meals throughout the rest of the year, the cost of those meals comes out of the school's general budget. This means there is less money to spend on teaching and learning.

There is a huge amount of financial pressure on all schools, and at Heathcoat Primary School, we would like to spend all of our money on the children's education.

PLEASE help us to achieve all the funding that we can by encouraging ALL children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 to have a school dinner that day. If your child is entitled to free school meals in Years 3-6, please encourage them to have a meal on that day.

Any child who has a school meal on Census day will be entered into a prize draw to win a book (1 book per year group).

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
PANTS rule

HPS TRAIN Values


Our school ethos is value driven with good values taught integrally to all that we do. We want all our children to grow up valuing themselves, others and the environment.
